Preston/Hancock Experience

On August 12, 2012, the day after more than 500 Camp Wayne for Boys and Girls campers leave camp for the summer, the Preston/Hancock Experience begins its third summer at Wayne. More than 40 children from the local community will experience an exciting five-day, day camp experience at no cost. Principals and teachers in the local elementary schools select campers based on their effort in the classroom, being good citizens, committing to attend camp for four successive summers and pledging to graduate high school.

The program has seen some incredible results after just two years, thanks in no small part to the efforts of directors, Michael and Randy Corpuel. The energy and dedication that they've put into the program is a real inspiration. Almost 100% of the campers have returned following their first summer! The camp experience has become the highlight of the year for many of the campers. School administrators have reported improved grades and effort from program participants.

Camp Wayne Alumni have stepped up to the plate as both volunteers and donors. Alumni staff, comprised of high school seniors, college students and adults have been a prime reason for the success of the camp. Donations from alumni, have helped pay for camper tee shirts, backpacks, and art supplies and have also allowed for the creation of an endowment fund for college scholarships for Preston/Hancock Experience campers.
