This Summer will be the 5th Anniversary of the Preston/Hancock Experience, a one week camp for children who live near Camp Wayne, and do not have the resources to attend camp. Camp Wayne donates it's facilities each summer in late August to the Preston/Hancock Experience and the Directors provide administrative support.

In 2014 more than 50 children will attend the Preston/Hancock Experience, some for the 5th summer. Children are selected by their teachers and school administrators based on financial need, being good citizens, trying hard in school, making a commitment to attend camp for four summers and pledging to graduate high school.
