This summer, Camp Erin NYC 2023 was home to both laughter and tears. The campers worked through some difficult emotions, but there was also a lot of camp joy sprinkled throughout our weekend of hope and healing. The amazing group of 55 children and teens navigated through their grief with the support of their new friends, bunk buddies and grief guides. What we learn at Camp Erin every summer is that magic is possible in a very short amount of time. Although we see progress in just a few days, Camp Erin is also just a jumping off point for our campers. Our goal is for them to go back home with renewed possibility of hope and healing, the recognition that they are not alone, and the realization that ALL of their feelings are valid. Many of the camper comments reflect those thoughts and it is a privilege to be by their side on their journey.



Not only is their grief journey impacted, but many

campers conquered some of their biggest fears and felt so empowered and proud- climbing the rock wall, swimming in the lake and talking in front of people -to name just a few. Those are the feelings they put in their tool box of strategies gathered over the weekend, to help them when they are struggling.
